Jesus and the _____ Man (Mark 10:17-27 NRSV)

Narrator: ¹⁷As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him,

Man: "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus: "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. ¹⁹You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.'"

Man: "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth."

Narrator: ²¹Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said,

- Jesus: "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."
- Narrator: ²²When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. ²³Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples,
- Jesus: "How hard it will be for those who have <u>wealth</u> to enter the kingdom of God!"
- Narrator: ²⁴The disciples were perplexed at these words, so Jesus said to them again,
- Jesus: "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is <u>rich</u> to enter the kingdom of God."

Disciples [astounded]: "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus: "For mortals, [salvation] is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."
